including their favourite spots and recommendations for visitors.




LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

ABOUT OAKVILLE

Located on the shores of Lake Ontario about 30 km/18.5 miles southwest of Toronto and 90 km/56 miles from Niagara falls, Oakville is a gem within the Greater Toronto Area (GTA). With a growing and diverse population of over 200,000, Oakville embodies the charm of a small town, with the amenities and conveniences of a city.

Oakville's waterfront is must-see. Serene at times, active at others, it is always photo ready. It is home to a variety of eye-catching wildlife including loons, swans, the white owl of Bronte, and more. Harbours in Bronte and Downtown Oakville are popular spots to take in the scenery. Other shoreline parks, including Gairloch Gardens and Coronation Park, are well worth a visit.

Oakville has three Business Improvement Areas (BIAs), Downtown Oakville, Kerr Village and Bronte Village. Each area has its own distinct personality but offers common elements: shopping and dining options that will satisfy a variety of styles and palates.

Explore the town's history at the Oakville Museum, including the importance of the lakefront as an entry point for many American slaves travelling the Underground Railroad, as well as to the development of early industries.

A LOCAL PERSPECTIVE: CHARLES

Can you tell us a little bit about yourself and how long you've lived in Oakville?

My husband and I moved to Oakville in 2020 at the peak of the pandemic. We were looking for open space and wanted a strong sense of community. I've lived in Toronto, Miami, Pittsburgh and Texas, in urban to suburban neighbourhoods, but never felt home like I do in Oakville. It is so unique because of its small-town charm, which comes from a welcoming community, walkable areas, and resident pride that you can feel – but with the amenities of a larger city.

What are some hidden gems in Oakville that visitors might not know about?

Oakville Centre for Performing Arts, located in the heart of Downtown Oakville, is a gem. It opened in 1977 and has been a focal point for cultural life in Oakville ever since. They host a variety of performances, but my favourites are the Oakville Symphony concerts. They are a community orchestra with a new and talented Conductor and Music Director, Lorenzo Guggenheim.

What are your favorite restaurants or cafes in Oakville?

Stoney's Bread Company in Kerr Village has amazing sandwiches, and the service is so friendly. Also, at the top of my list is Thai Siam in the Upper Oakville Shopping Centre. Their food is so delicious!

What is your favorite park in Oakville?

There are so many beautiful parks in Oakville. However, Post Park is my go-to and the best if you have a four-legged friend. An enclosed off-leash dog park surrounded by mature trees is the perfect place to let our dog, Chloe, run free with her friends.

What are some of the best neighborhoods to explore in Oakville and why? Old Oakville features historic buildings, quaint shops, and parks. There is also Bronte Village, known for its marina, restaurants, and galleries. Finally is Kerr Village, a lively district with various shops, restaurants, and yearly events.

Is there anything else you think visitors should know about Oakville? Oakville is a wonderful place to visit. Whether you're outdoorsy, looking for great shopping, a foodie, or visiting for an event, adding an extra couple of nights to your itinerary to explore Oakville is the best advice I could give.

DOWNTOWN OAKVILLE

Downtown Oakville is an upscale lakeside shopping district rich in history and character. Here you'll find six blocks of beloved local shops, restaurants, and special boutiques and services, as well as top names in fashion.

Take a stroll through the area and spot the lovingly maintained heritage homes marked by plaques identifying the name and occupation of the original owner, and the year of construction. The Oakville Museum, Thomas House, and the Oakville Historical Society are located here.

Visit Lakeside Park and enjoy the views of the Toronto skyline. Mature trees shade the park, providing an ideal place for a picnic, a run-around the playground, or simply watching the boats sail by.

From DIY classes and wellness events to sidewalk sales and street musicians, there is always something happening Downtown. Don't miss the sights and sounds of the Hometown Holiday experience starting in November, or the TD Summer Music Series on Saturdays and Sundays in July and August.

Paid parking is located along the lakeshore and in municipal parking lots throughout the area. Free limited small street parking is also available.

BRONTE VILLAGE

Bronte Village is one of Ontario's oldest communities. Established in 1834 as a small fishing settlement at the mouth of the Twelve Mile Creek, it quickly became a major trading post and, in the 1950s, a vacation spot for families from Toronto and the region. Today it is a beautiful destination known for its marine heritage.

On the harbour's east side, you will find friendly owner-operated specialty shops, galleries, and diverse award-winning dining options. You can grab an ice cream, walk to the pier, enjoy the views and explore Fishermen's Warf Memorial. Take a seat on one of the of the hand-painted Muskoka Chairs throughout the neighborhood, which are part of the ongoing "At Home in Bronte Outdoor Art Exhibit."

Kerr Village is a vibrant and unique community, nestled in the heart of Oakville, within walking distance of the Lake and Downtown Oakville. The Village is a trendy and eclectic neighbourhood offering a mix of welcoming hospitality and urban revitalization.

In the heart of Kerr Village, you will find a selection of independently owned retailers, specialty stores, yoga studios, and spas, and, as many locals will tell you, some of the best cafes and restaurants in town. This trendy area boasts businesses representing 39 different cultures.


Don't miss KerrFest Kids in September and the lighting of the Kerr Village Christmas tree in late November or early December, two signature events that provide fun for the whole family.



CAMPING IN OAKVILLE

Take your vacation away from the crowds and spend some time under the stars at one of Bronte Creek Provincial Park's four campground loops.

Things to do:

- Reconnect with nature and relax by the campfire
- Explore the history of Spruce Lane Farmhouse
- Attend Educational Discovery Programs (Follow @opbrontecreek on Instagram to see the programs and schedules.)
- Travelling with kids? Don't miss the Play Barn, farm animals and outdoor playaround
- Play a round of Disc Golf
- Hike or bike one of 5 trails: Maiden's Blush Trail, Trillium Trail, Ravine Trail, Gateway Trail. Halfmoon Valley Trail.
- Take your furry family member for a run at the leash-free dog park
- Watch for over 190 species of birds in their habitat
- Fish in the Twelve-Mile creek for rainbow trout, splake, steelhead and Pacific salmon.

Getting Here

The park has two entrances on the opposite sides of the ravine. For the camping entrance, take Bronte Road to Upper Middle Road and go West. For day visits, use the entrance on Burloak Drive.

ON THE WATER

Oakville's 17km waterfront is home to two beautiful harbours and many lakeside parks, making Oakville a gem for those looking to experience life on the water.

Paddling

Paddling along the shores of Lake Ontario, Sixteen Mile Creek or Bronte Creek, is a neat way to see Oakville. Bring a kayak, canoe or paddleboard and sightsee from Oakville's shoreline.

Boating

Take a trip up the Sixteen Mile Creek with CharterAbility, a registered charity that provides accessible recreational boating. Cruise the lake and do some fishing with one of several boat charter companies. Coming in on your own vessel? Contact Bronte Outer Harbour Marina at 905-827-7575 or visit *Oakville.ca* for more information.

Fishing

Oakville offers a variety of angling opportunities, including spots at both Bronte Creek and Sixteen Mile Creek that harbour trout and salmon action during the spring and fall.

New this year: fishing from August 1 – October 15. Night fishing is permitted from 9 pm - 12 am from Oakville piers.

ON THE TRAILS

Oakville's extensive trail system is over 200km and invites you to explore the natural wonders of local forests and the splendor of seasonal changes.

Hiking

Steps away from many streets in Oakville is access to the trail system where you can hike, bike, run or walk.

Cycling

Oakville hosts plenty of multi-use trail systems that allow cyclists to explore these natural escapes on wheels. Take advantage of local bike corrals and repair stations when exploring routes like the Crosstown Trail.

Bird Watching

Oakville is a great place for novice and experienced birders alike to view a variety of woodland birds and waterfowl, like the pileated woodpecker, Baltimore oriole and red-tailed hawk.

Snowshoeing and Cross-Country Skiing

Don't let winter shut you indoors. Many of Oakville's trails are perfect for cross-country skiing, including those at Bronte Creek Provincial Park.


Catch a round of Disc Golf at the 18-hole course at Bronte Creek Provincial Park. While you are there, explore nature and take in the fresh air.

HISTORY

Oakville is steeped in a rich history dating back to the early 1800s that has been well preserved and documented by local historians.

Step back in time and learn about Oakville lore with these local institutions.

Oakville Museum - 8 Navv Street

The Oakville Museum, located in Erchless Estate, is the former home of Oakville's founding family, the Chisholms. Explore rotating exhibits and learn about Oakville's Black History with their permanent exhibits, Freedom, Opportunity and Family: Oakville's Black History and The Underground Railroad: Next Stop Freedom.

Howard Iron Works - 800 Westgate Road

Explore this hidden gem that unlocks the history of printing. This museum is home to printing machinery dating from the 1830s to the 1950s, including iron presses, platens, bindery equipment, trade journals and more.

Old Oakville Lighthouse - Oakville Yacht Squadron

The Old Oakville Lighthouse is one of the town's first landmarks, originally built in 1837 to mark the mouth of Sixteen Mile Creek at Lake Ontario. Destroyed by a severe storm in 1886, the current lighthouse was built in 1889 and served as a navigational aid until 1960. Now retired from duty, the visitors can explore this historic structure and learn about its role in the town's early history.

Historic Houses

Oakville is home to several historic houses that have been preserved and restored. Explore the Merrick Thomas House, Coach House, Oakville's First Post Office, and Sovereign House. These unique structures offer a glimpse into the town's past. Whether you're interested in learning about early settlers or notable residents these historic houses are a must-visit for anyone interested in local history and culture.

Whether you want to admire art or try your hand at creating it, the centre provides a welcoming space to learn and explore.

The Sovereign House - 7 W River St

Sovereign House, set on the picturesque Bronte Bluffs, is open Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday from 1 to 4 pm. Sovereign House is home to Art on the Bluffs. Local artists showcase their creations weekly from late May to the end of October. Free parking is available in the lot adjacent to Sovereign House.
