Did you know that Oakville served as a major gateway to Canada for those fleeing slavery using the Underground Railway? Many first entered Canada through Oakville, usually by boat or on foot, and the legacy of their contributions to our community endure. History

Oakville is located on the Treaty Lands and Territory of the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation, whose ancestors arrived in this area towards the end of the 17th Century and left a mark on this place that endures today. Learn more about the rich culture and heritage of the Mississaugas, known as "people of the water" for their strong connection to and understanding of the area's lakes, rivers, and water sources. Explore interpretive Treaty signage throughout Oakville that explains this land and follow the posted QR codes to learn more about the Debwewin Project, a partnership between the Mississaugas of the Credit First Nation and the Oakville Community Foundation to further a shared understanding of Oakville's Indigenous past and support local Truth & Reconciliation.

 2025. This project involved over a thousand children in the production of
 the ship's sails.

Oakville is a huge supporter of Culture Days and in 2023, the annual Culture Days celebration in Oakville received many accolades and was ranked first overall in the Culture Days 2023 Top Participating Communities Listing! This year, Oakville will have a Creative in Residence Shary Boyle who will create a large-scale effigy sculpture, "The Sleeper: What keeps you up at night?", an installation in the Oakville Museum's Erchless Estate.
